### Summer Forums 2008

The Adult Religious Education Committee is encouraging Friends to start a new series of forums during the summer of 2008. Although we have never held forums in the summer months, the ARE would like to have summer forums this year on the meaning of Quaker Testimonies.

The ARE committee, however, will not be organizing these forums; instead the committee is asking people to sign up as Forum leaders/facilitators for each of the scheduled meetings (the sign-up sheet is posted on the inside of the front door of the Meeting House). The plan is to explore the meaning of one Quaker Testimony or Quaker belief at each forum.

At least two persons will serve as co-facilitators for each conversation—and each forum will offer opportunities to share beliefs and concerns. If nobody signs up for a particular date, we will not hold the Forum in that week. Forums will not take place on the days before and after the Gathering of the Friends General Conference; and Meeting for Worship with Attention to Business will replace the forum on the third First Day of August. All forums will meet between 9:45 and 10:45am in the Meeting House.

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**Chapel Hill Monthly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends  
Meeting for Worship with Attention to Business  
May 18, 2008  
Minutes**

1. The minutes for the April Meeting for Worship with Attention to Business we accepted with no revisions.
2. Recommendation for membership for Lauren Carreto - Jim Bartow reported Ministry & Worship's recommendation of Lauren Carreto for membership. Jim Bartow was clerk of Lauren Carreto's clearness committee. Other members included Dirk Spruyt, Perry Martin, Robin Harper, Matt Drake, and Bonnie Raphael. Jim reported that Lauren was his niece Oriana's "sensei" or teacher of life for many years. Lauren views teaching as a two-way process of giving and receiving and will both give and receive as a member of the meeting. He noted that she will challenge the Meeting with her concern for the environment. Others noted the valuable role she played in the youth program for the recent Piedmont Friends Fellowship retreat. Friends approved the committee's recommendation of membership. A welcoming committee was created that includes Jim Bartow, Robin Harper, Hank Elkins, James Harper, and Terry Mehlman.
3. Nominations Committee Recommendations for Committee Membership for 2008-2009 – Initial review and consideration. Tom Munk reported for Nominations. The committee met for several months and successfully and smoothly



filled committees. With the exception of Piedmont Friends Fellowship, the committee feels all committees are strong. The committee recommends that we lay down the Carolina Friends Early School liaison committee. Faye Stanley is clerk of Nominations and will continue to receive names of volunteers. The names for clerk, recording clerk and trustees remain unchanged. These names will be added to this list for decision approval next month. The Meeting acknowledged appreciation for the hard work of the committee – Annette Broadwell, Poly Ulin, Jeff Brown, John Hite, Susan Inglis, Faye Stanley, and Tom Munk all served this past year. Candace noted that the list includes consultants for Buildings & Grounds and added that Library has several ‘consultants’ names to send to Tom for inclusion on next month’s list. In response to questions, the following items were clarified. The Clerk has nominated Anne Filiaci to also serve on Nominations Committee next year. Sarah White will leave for new adventures and not serve next year as First Day school coordinator. Lauren Hart will meet with Carolyn Stuart and Beth Kurtz-Costes to explore her potential for this job and possibly bring her name forward for approval at next month’s meeting. Terry Melhman noted that her name was omitted from M&W, to be added on next month’s list. Approval of the list of nominees was held over until June.

4. Treasurer’s Report – Judy Purvis reported that over past two months, almost all benevolences have been paid up to date. She will complete the benevolence payments by the end of the fiscal year. Funds held at Friends Fiduciary have lost a little bit of value in the first quarter 2008, expect similar results for second quarter. The Meeting’s revenues for the year are about \$10,000 below budgeted expenses and have been below expenses for a few years. If necessary, funds will be withdrawn from Friends Fiduciary to cover expenses. Friends accepted this report with appreciation. Buffie Webber, the clerk of Finance Committee, noted that they have several new members joining and will have a strong committee for next year. She noted that many committees under spend their budgets for the year but this is not necessarily a positive. Some individuals absorb expenses instead of being reimbursed. Individuals are encouraged to submit receipts for expenses as this will allow the meeting to better account for actual costs.

5. Finance Committee Recommendations for 2008-2009 Budget – initial review and consideration. Buffie Webber presented the proposed budget for 2008-2009. Hank Elkins then presented further detail on the proposed be-

nevolences, which have been revised somewhat based on input during the April Meeting. He noted that CFS benevolence has been reduced from a full day tuition at CHES to a half day, which is the historic level of spending, based on recommendation that this would expand our budget in times that are difficult.

Friends discussed the need to be clear about why we are raising funds collectively to make collective gifts and why individuals should send money to CHFM instead of making donations directly? We need to clearly discern where we are going and what we are trying to achieve. Friends make gifts based on their passions. A friend suggested that finance make a pyramid of donations available to illustrate the proportion of individuals giving at different levels. Friends expressed concern about the reduction in contribution to the Carolina Friends School. The money funds a scholarship, which helps to increase the diversity of the school. Concern was raised that Planned Parenthood does not belong on the list. Concern was expressed that we acknowledge the budget gap and not approve a budget that can't realistically be raised. Questions were raised about how to increase donations so we aren't worried about under spending on programs. Approval of the budget was held over until June. Friends expressed great appreciation for the work of Judy Purvis, Buffie Webber, and Terry Mehlman in getting the finances organized.
